Christmas Tree Recycling

Last year the Arthur Rank Hospice Charity's Christmas Tree Recycling Scheme collected over 2,500 trees and raised over £36,000; this year it is hoped that the collection will be the greatest success yet, with hopes of raising £40,000 for the Hospice.

A team of 70+ volunteers will be collecting trees between Thursday 7th and Sunday 10th January. In exchange, a donation to the Hospice would be warmly welcomed. After costs, 90% of the monies raised will go to the Hospice which provides essential support and end of life care to adults living with an advanced serious illness or other life-limiting condition. The remaining 10% will be donated to The Rotary Club of Cambridge, to support further local good causes.

The trees will be chipped at temporary drop off points and used as mulch or taken to local waste recycling centres for composting.

The scientists have worked hard together to beat Covid 19, and here in the Cambridge area there is so much research with medicine, engineering and so on, which we benefit from.

The parishes have changed in the last few months with a greater sense of community in the villages. People have had time to meet their neighbours because of the lockdown. Weston Colville Parish Council

A meeting held at 7.30pm on Monday 7th December included the following items.

Public Participation Session – a parishioner spoke about the proposed bridge works at the bottom of Horseshoe Lane; disappointment was expressed that there had been no consultation with the residents, and that there were no plans available. It was explained that the area is controlled by Highways, and there is no requirement to consult either the PC or residents, as this is a different situation to a planning application. The works that are due to be carried out include moving and shortening the existing bridge to span the Stour on the right-hand side as you look at it from Horseshoe Lane. Revetments will be created to strengthen the banks. The bridge is to be moved to allow the culvert that feeds into the Stour to be kept clear, which should alleviate flooding.

Planning – a presentation was given by Thurlow Estate representatives before the planning application 20/04597/FUL for additional grain store, handling facilities and silos at Weston Woods Farm was discussed by the council. After a discussion it was agreed to support the application.

Street Lighting – an update was given stating that five of the nine streetlights have been changed to LEDs, three having had new poles. The remaining lights should be changed soon. Once they have all been changed the running costs can be reviewed and other suppliers investigated.

Flooding – there will be a capital project involving the design of new drains at Church End to improve road drainage. The bridge at the bottom of Horseshoe Lane will be closed for three days when the works start in week commencing 11th January (this date may be postponed depending on the weather/water levels).

Works had to be postponed on the banks on Common Road beyond 71/72 which were due to be scraped to increase water drainage, but an electricity cable has been identified running close to the surface which means the works may need to be carried out manually.

Speed Reduction – a report was received and update provided. Discussions had taken place with a representative of the County's Highways department which determines all Local Highways Improvement (LHI) grant applications. There was a suggestion that a pair of speed humps could be placed between Chapel Road and Horseshoe Lane. High speeds had been recorded on this stretch. Most other areas in the village would not be suitable for active speed reduction due to the width of the road, visibility before bends in the road, hills etc. It was determined that a copy of the guidance would be requested, and that a consultation carried out with the village, to garner the views of residents once some options had been developed. The closing date for the current round of applications is January 2021, so it would be hoped to submit an LHI application for January 2022.

Matters for Next Agenda – footpaths, speed reduction consultation, budget, precept.





Horseshoe Lane Ford and Bridge

The CCC Highways Department plans to relocate the footbridge by the ford at the end of Horseshoe Lane from the left bank to the right bank so that it easier to keep the Stour clear of silt, in an effort to alleviate flooding in the village. The work will also involve strengthening the banks of the Stour to stop erosion at this point of the river. The work is planned to take place during the week commencing 11th January. If the weather is not suitable or the water level is too high then the work will be postponed. During this work the footbridge will be closed for three days, and the council apologises for any inconvenience caused.
