West Wratting Book Club

Our April book was 'Underland: A Deep Time Journey' by Robert McFarlane.

Winner of the Wainwright Prize 2019 and Stanford Dolman Travel Book of the Year 2020, it covers many different aspects of the world beneath our feet, including the 'wood wide web' (the linked system of tree roots and fungi beneath the soil), the deep potash mines of Boulby, and the hidden tunnel systems beneath cities such as Paris and Istanbul. It was agreed that it was very well written. Other comments were beautiful, brilliant, fantastically well written. It draws together many subjects – geology, physics, glaciology, pre-history, archaeology, nature, mythology, ethics and philosophy. The descriptions were so well drawn that some found it very claustrophobic at times while one person felt that it included the best explanation of dark matter they had ever read, identifying strongly with the descriptions of the climbing and caving from their own experience. However one person couldn't get on with the science. Some of the descriptions of the use made of the amazing caves and tunnels of the Karst country of Slovenia were harrowing, the contrast of these horrors



As we enter May, I am looking forward, like many I imagine, to the further easing of lockdown restrictions which will allow us to



Nature Notes

Hello and a merry spring to you all. Spring visitors like Swallows and Blackcaps are here. Male Blackcaps (*Sylvia atricapilla*, or Northern Nightingale) have the eponymous black caps and smoke grey bodies, so can be mistaken for Marsh Tits; female and juvenile Blackcaps have bright chestnutbrown caps. Blackcaps appear much bigger and more torpedo-shaped than Marsh Tits. The Blackcaps' black cap does not come down the neck and the bird

is much more uniform grey in colour, and Marsh Tits have a small black bib under their chin, which Blackcaps don't have. The top photo is a Blackcap; the lower one is a Marsh Tit. The Blackcap's song is rich, melodic and deeper, as it's a bigger bird, while Marsh Tits





get by with a call which sounds like a high-pitched sneeze (Bless you!).

Your garden Marsh Tits have moved into mature deciduous woodland to breed. To let them raise their young in peace, we won't be ringing in the woods in May and June, but only in gardens.

Feral honeybees are being seen now, as are wasps. Adult bees and wasps are vegetarian and eat sugars, but all their larvae need protein to grow. While bee larvae are vegetarian, getting their protein from royal jelly and pollen (bee bread), wasp larvae are carnivorous, getting their protein from the wide range of animal prey brought in by adult wasps. This includes a lot of garden pests, like greenfly and caterpillars. The wasp larvae then secrete a sugary solution which the adult wasps eat.

In August and September, colonies are winding down for the winter and there are far fewer wasp larvae, so there's less sugar for the adult wasps, who have to find their sweet treats elsewhere – like your picnic!

Another interesting thing about wasp larvae is they don't poo at all. It's all stored within their guts, so entomologists can identify everything a wasp larva has eaten by DNA analysis of its gut. So you can easily determine what animals are present in the local environment, however well hidden they are, from wasp larval guts (I hope you can enjoy your dinner . . .).

Plants are like vegetables, best bought as local and as fresh as possible. That is the theory behind www.theplantplacewickham.com a small setup that has started growing hardy perennials in West Wickham.

Plants should also not cost a fortune to buy (although some plants and shrubs can be very difficult to cultivate and therefore do become more expensive due to time and care). Also, the miles many plants travel across the continent before they ever reach our shores should be considered, and the environmental cost of everything involved.

As an experiment, Jan Lupton began growing hardy perennials locally. The mantra behind the project is 'local plants for local people'.

This year she has been cautious as to what could be achieved in the greenhouse, but has put together a little website to accommodate the plant details for local gardeners, and is finding out what local people are looking for. She said that they seem to like the idea of buying local.

Rapid Covid-19 Testing for All

Since Friday 9th April everyone has been urged to take twice-weekly Covid tests. These are rapid lateral flow tests for people who do not have any of the symptoms of Coronavirus. (Anyone who has symptoms should still isolate at home and organise to take a PCR test.)

Twice-weekly rapid testing will help to identify cases of Covid-19 that would otherwise be missed. With one in three people with coronavirus showing no symptoms and potentially spreading it without knowing, rapid testing of people with no symptoms helps to identify positive cases quickly, preventing the spread of infection. The test usually involves taking a sample from your tonsils (or where they would have been) and from your nose, using a swab. You can get a result in 30 minutes.

There are several ways to access rapid testing:

Community testing: you can take a supervised test at rapid testing sites locally, set up to test asymptomatic adults.

NHS Test & Trace sites: these operate as symptomatic testing sites in the morning but are currently providing an afternoon collect option, where you can pick up a box of tests to use at home.

Pharmacy collect: visit a participating pharmacy and pick up a free box of tests to use at home. Our nearest pharmacy collection sites are the pharmacy in Linton on the High Street, and pharmacies in Haverhill and Newmarket.

The Gov.UK website gives details of how to order the tests, or find local collection or test sites.

I have been equally impressed by the hard work and commitment of teachers and support staff. Having adjusted to the requirements of teaching and learning in the Covid-19 contexts and the challenges that this has presented, students and staff are now adapting to the requirements of a teacher-led assessment process.

It is no surprise that the global pandemic has led to a surge in applications for teacher training. While some of this may have been motivated by the job security associated with the profession, the privilege, job satisfaction and sense of reward that comes from supporting young people in their education has been highlighted in the current context.
