West Wratting Book Club

We discussed Isabel Allende's 'Daughter of Fortune' and all agreed it was a good read, noting particularly her descriptive powers. We are led by her characters from China and England to Chile, to the bleak streets and timid sun of Valparaiso and then to the California of the 49ers in the Gold Rush.

We noted the book deals in adventure, secrets, and cruelty, both in the treatment of girls in China and of the different races in the lawlessness of the wild west. One interesting observation was that Allende's outlaws were at times from good families and that something unfortunate in their lives 'sets them off'. We agreed with one of our group's recognition of a central theme of freedom, whether it be sailing the world or travelling to a new life. Another of us recognised the way that people in South America 'hedge their bets' with simultaneous attendance at the Papal Church and belief in herbal remedies, something she had seen for herself living in Bolivia.

The novel is written with gentle comedy, poetry and sensuous detail that one of us felt was just the right side of explicit. If there was a criticism, it was that there is abundant historical detail which some felt was fascinating but tedious in a novel, and others felt was overdone amid the narrative. The ending was seen as

abrupt by one reader, but another pointed out Allende has left us wanting more as this is the middle of a trilogy, followed by 'Portrait in Sepia'.

Responsible Dog Ownership – Please Control Your Dogs

I have recently had the unpleasant experience of having my dog attacked by other dogs when out walking. To make matters worse, on two separate occasions the dog owners did not attempt to control their dog by immediately putting them on the lead, show any sense of concern, or discipline the dog in any way.

Please be aware that under the Dangerous Dogs Act 1991 the owner commits a criminal offence if the dog is dangerously out of control in a public place. If your dog is aggressive to other dogs or people, please have the good sense and courtesy to keep them on a close lead, at least until you are absolutely sure there is noone else in the vicinity. It will be understandable if parishioners consider reporting those with uncontrolled aggressive dogs to the police as a responsibility to protect children and the vulnerable. With respect to the Countryside Code, it is clear that you must keep your dog 'under control'. It states that if 'your dog has unreliable recall' you should keep it on a lead.

Annual Poppy Collection Saturday 30th October – Sunday 14th November

Poppies and other poppy appeal items will be available for donations at The Chestnut Tree and in Balsham at the Post Office, The Coffee Shop, The Bell and The Black Bull.



A few centenary RBL poppy pins will be available for a suggested donation of £4, and the usual dated pins for 2021 will be available as soon as possible (for which the suggested donation is £2), along with wooden crosses, wrist bands, clip on reflector poppies and snap rulers.

A Just Giving website will be available for donations (with Gift Aid if wished) under the name 'Margaret's 2021 Poppy Appeal'. This is how the Poppy Appeal will likely go ahead in our four villages from now on, in response to keeping everyone as safe as possible in view of Covid-19, because it is increasingly difficult to find people willing to do house-to-house collecting (many of the present collectors are in their 80s after volunteering for many years), also as more and more people do not use cash any longer.

Last year the much reduced collection still raised almost £1,900 including Gift Aid, which was fantastic








Nature Notes

Welcome to autumn proper. The countryside fruits and nuts have ripened and the wild folk are stripping them clean, preparing for the few lean months ahead. If you'd like another challenge, try beating the Squirrels to the ripe wild Hazelnuts!

This is a very good time to put out sunflower hearts and fat blocks for the birds. Young Marsh Tits are very visible now, as Mum and Dad are kicking them out of their home territories and they're coming to gardens for food. (Sightings of Marsh Tits, please, to cambsmarti@gmail.com or Chassenge – thanks!)

The Squirrels love your food too. One good solution is the SquirrelBuster feeder, at £20 - £50 each. Another is this invention of mine using a large Tupperware or paint pot lid, a plant pot, garden wire



wire onto the lid, pushing it down. This causes the plant pot to push the feeder away from the Squirrel, who – if he's not

careful - slides off onto the lawn below. This apparatus has been working well in the garden of my other half Eileen for over a vear now. I've added a lid below (to stop the Magpies jumping up from the ground) and bottlebrushes (puts off the Starlings, which perch at the sides). After a couple of days to get used to the novelty, all the other birds still feed avidly,



including Robins, Long-tailed and other Tits and Great Spotted Woodpeckers. Birdfood costs have plummeted and the still-fat Squirrels and friends twitch their tails in frustration. What's not to like?

Personally, I wouldn't eat any blackberries now, as they have become tough and bitter. Christian mythology has it that blackberries are poisonous after Michaelmas (29th September), when the devil pees on them. Interestingly, in Hertfordshire, Sussex, Worcestershire and Norfolk, blackberries are said to remain sweet and tasty for an extra 11 days; they are free of diabolical urine until at least 10th October. There is a rational explanation for this, and a prize for anyone who tells me why before next month, via cambsmarti@gmail.com or Chassenge. (If you want a clue, it's old hat).

For our October meeting I gave a talk on 'Putting Your Garden to Bed'.

Although never professing to be a specialist, I explained how my husband Andrew and I have moved four times with my husband's job, and three of the properties we bought were new, with new gardens to design and plant. We learnt through trial and error, and as our first bungalow was built in Bressingham we were influenced by Alan and Adrian Bloom's Bressingham garden. We also visit RHS Wisley, one of our favourite places to be, once a fortnight when child minding our grandson.

I explained about all the little jobs you have to do in the garden before winter arrives which will make life so much easier in the spring, and illustrated the talk with pictures of our garden in Balsham in the summer and autumn, and the dahlias at Anglesey Abbey which are stunning at this time of year.

- People aged 16 and over with a health condition that puts them at high risk of getting seriously ill from COVID-19
- Carers aged 16 and over
- People aged 16 and over who live with someone who is more likely to get infections (such as someone who has HIV, has had a transplant or is having certain treatments for cancer, lupus or rheumatoid arthritis).

If you are pregnant and in one of the eligible groups listed above you can also get a booster dose.

If you are a frontline health or social care worker you can book a booster dose appointment online – you do not need to wait to be contacted by the NHS.
