










#### From the Rectory

#### Weston Colville Parish Council

The following items were discussed at the meeting held on Monday 7th November. The full minutes can be found on www.westoncolville.org.uk

Resignation of Councillors – the resignations of Faye Parker and James Hubbard had been received. Both were thanked for their service to the village. An advert will be placed in Chasses for new councillors to join the council by co-option.

Flooding – a letter will be included in Chassenge, as an insert, and added to the website.

Highways Update – the gulleys on Mill Hill had been cleared, all bar three that could not be cleared. Grip cutting requires a year's notice, which would affect the grips on Common Road. Brian Heffernan would chase up the drainage issues at Church End, as the Highways Officer responsible had left the County Council. The topic of objects being placed on verges was raised, to prevent vehicles going on them, and whether the PC could do anything about them. Cllr Ashbridge advised that it was a very grey area in legal terms, it was felt that the PC could not act, as it would be difficult to determine ownership of the verges and that Highways were not interested.

Traffic Calming – the SID (speed indicator device) was moved around when it was available. Cllr Ashbridge delivered the report that had been provided in autumn 2021, which was to apply for passive measures, gates/additional roundels. In Kentford and Whittlesford curbs had been built out to cause road narrowing, and street lighting was not needed. It was also suggested that the PC could apply for a MVAS (mobile vehicle activated sign). Following discussion of several options, it was proposed to defer applying for the current year, and to hold a meeting with parishioners and Highways.

#### **GCP Making Connections Consultation –**

Cllr Vidler will comment on behalf of the PC. The consultation had been added to the village WhatsApp and Facebook groups.

Emails – following an Internal Audit report, dedicated email addresses for councillors were discussed, to be in line with GDPR Regulations. The format will be *cllrfirstname.surname@westoncolville.org.uk* Cllr Pagonis will look into whether the accounts could have charitable status, thus reducing the price.

ICO (Information Commissioner's Office)— the council will register with ICO as data controller at an annual cost of £35.

**Reading Room Warm Hub** – the council will support the Warm Hub for one month from the middle of November for £150, and review in January.

**Poppy Wreath** – £10 will be donated for the wreath which will be laid on behalf of Weston Colville PCC this year.

**Risk Assessment/Health and Safety** – the defibrillator was rescue-ready on 7<sup>th</sup> November.

**Playground** – Cllr Pagonis volunteered to take on the playgrounds following Cllr Hubbard's resignation.

**Dates of Parish Council Meetings** – 5<sup>th</sup> December (planning), Wednesday 11<sup>th</sup> January 2023, Monday 6<sup>th</sup> March, Monday 1<sup>st</sup> May.

#### Abandoned Car

It is not intended for long term storage of vehicles no longer roadworthy. If this car belongs to you, we would appreciate it being moved immediately. If the car is still there at the end of the year, the parish council will arrange for its removal, but work to identify the legal owner to recover the costs. Otherwise, the cost of the removal will have to be borne by parishioners.

#### West Wratting Parish Council

The following items were some of the matters discussed at the parish council meeting held on 14th November. The full draft minutes will be posted on the noticeboards.

**Councillors:** it was agreed and confirmed that Tim Bonfield and Martin Davey would act as representatives for the council on the Village Hall Management Committee.

#### **Planning\*:**

*CCC/22/057/FUL Gt Wilbraham Chalk Pit* – it was agreed no comments were necessary.

20/01564 Planning Appeal Land South East of Burton End, West Wickham – it was agreed to stand by comments formerly made against this planning application.

22/04689 73 The Lamb Yard, High St – it was agreed that the building needed to be demolished.

**Finance:** the second half of the precept had been received. Cllr Parsons agreed to become a bank signatory.

#### **Maintenance:**

*Winter gritting* – volunteers are needed to salt the road from the salt bins provided. This is not required often

as the roads are gritted by CCC. Please contact the parish clerk or a councillor for more details.

Parking spaces in Hayter Close – a sign has been placed in the Close for residential parking only.

#### **Recreation Ground & Pavilion:**

The parish clerk has received all the necessary certificates, risk assessments, etc for the Sports Pavilion required for the annual audit.

It was agreed that the *grass cutting contribution* paid annually by the parish council to the WWFC would be increased by 10% as from 2023.

Cllr Parsons said she would be willing to take on the task of checking the defibrillator regularly if Martin Davey did not wish to continue with this job.

*Cones* – the WWFC would only put out cones on the crossing. Anyone wishing to keep their entrances open would need to put their own cones out.

**Traffic issues & Speed Restriction equipment:** it is anticipated that the sign poles will be erected in December.

#### **Greater Cambridgeshire Partnership**

**Consultation:** Cllr Batchelor urged the parish council and residents to respond to this, particularly with regard to the proposed congestion charge which would include Addenbrookes Hospital.

Trees to Commemorate the Queen's Death: the parish council is happy to donate a grant for a tree to commemorate the reign of the Queen. Hayter Close was not considered an ideal site; possibly the recreation ground or Pocket Park.

**Next Parish Council meeting:** Monday 9th January 2023. All are welcome.

#### District and County Councillor's Report **City Access Consultation**

A 'Sustainable Travel Zone' road user charge has been put forward by the Greater Cambridge Partnership (the body currently implementing the upgrades to the A1307) for private vehicles between 7 am and 7 pm on weekdays. The plans are part of a package to improve public transport, reduce congestion in the city, and help the environment through lower emissions.

A £5 congestion charge to drive into and around Cambridge is being considered as part of a 'once in a generation' plan to shake up how people travel during the working week.

These proposals are now being publicly consulted on and it is vitally important that as many people as possible respond to this consultation with their views. It will be one of the largest decisions that will affect the way that we travel in and out of Cambridge for generations to come. 

#### A1307 Update

The majority of the work here is complete but the remaining schemes to be implemented are the new roundabout on the A1307 at the end of Bartlow Road. Linton, the remodelling of the highly dangerous Dean Road junction on the A1307, both due spring 2023, and the implementation of the 'Greenway', the nonmotorised user route between Linton and Cambridge.

#### **Electric Vehicle Charging Grant**

It is expected that proposals will be approved by the end of November for a new grant scheme to parish councils and operators of community buildings, for grants of up to £5,000 to support installation of publicly accessible electric vehicle charge points in order to encourage electric vehicle uptake within the district

- or, during the same period, have resided in that area or within three miles thereof;
- or, during the same period, had his/her principal or only place of work in that area.


