Our April book was 'Jamaica Inn' by Daphne du Maurier, set in 19th century Cornwall on dark, brooding Bodmin Moor and the surrounding area, with weather to match, and centred on the once welcoming but now dark and menacing coaching inn, Jamaica Inn. It is the story of the young woman, Mary Yellan, who travels to live with her aunt after the death of her mother only to find her much changed since her marriage to the rough, violent and sinister Joss Merlyn.

The language and descriptions are beautiful and evocative, highlighting the contrast between the gentle south coast and the violent roughness of the north, and the dark bleak moorland. These are worth

taking time over, but it can be difficult to do so, such is the desire to find out what will happen next.

Apart from the adventure story, the position of women in society and their treatment in contrast to men is a major theme. This may relate to du Maurier's own frustrations at not having the freedoms that men had.

Only one person was not inspired to keep reading, finding the descriptions and characters a little overblown. This is a recommended read. Scores were 9 out of 10 except for one 6.

Our next book is 'A Gentleman in Moscow' by Amor Towles. We will meet to discuss it on Wednesday 15th May at The Chestnut Tree at 7.30 pm.




